Think Safety!

Exercise & Diving

Divers Alert Network – Neil Pollach Doc Viking's - Exercise and DCS

As everyone knows, exercise is an important part of everyday life. Being fit and in shape makes diving more relaxing and enjoyable. Staying in shape helps reduce some of the risks associated with diving. Having healthy lungs and an efficient circulatory system means you will use less air and being in good physical shape can help to prevent panic attacks. A fit body will expel carbon dioxide more efficiently. General strength helps you lift tanks and gear. A healthy weight lowers your risk of Decompression Sickness (DCS) as fat retains nitrogen longer.

Now that we know the importance of staying fit, we need to juggle physical exercise and diving. Studies show that highintensity aerobic exercises 24 hours before a chamber dive decreased the number of nitrogen bubbles in tissue, reducing the risk of DCS. The effects of exercise closer to, and before 24 hours after diving, showed increased bubble formation, increasing risk of DCS. The bottom line is that physical fitness, including both strength and aerobic capacity, is important for divers for physical strength and decompression safety. Additionally intense physical exercise should be avoided 24 hours before and after diving Karin



(Continued from page 6) Point Lobos is a protected game preserve and nothing may be taken from the waters in the park. Because there is no hunt-



ing the fish feel safe and curious about us. We often see more and bigger fish here than elsewhere on our beautiful coast. The visibility is often better here too, because it borders the Carmel Trench and the open ocean. Reservations can be



made 2 months in advance of the dive date. Weekend dates almost always fill fast so we need to make

our reservations just after midnight on Monday, November 8 (Please stay up late on Sunday, November 7 so that you can hit send right after midnight). Each diver can make up to 2 team reservations. If you can please try for two teams and let me know if you are successful. You can name your usual buddy as the second team leader and I'm sure other club members will want to fill any openings that we have. It can take several days for the ranger at Point Lobos to confirm your reservation. If you are unsuccessful please let me know so that I can try to match you with openings on other members teams.

Recipe of the month

Abalone potstickers

Ingredients:

Potstickers:

1 lb ground abalone (I use a food processor to grind mine in)

8 leaves of celery cabbage (Napa cabbage) ¼ cup finely chopped chives

1 cube of chilled chicken stock, mashed

1 teaspoon of (Chinese) five spice powder

1 tablespoon minced ginger

1 tablespoon white wine (or water)

1 tablespoon of light sodium soy sauce

1 teaspoon cornstarch

1 teaspoon sesame oil

Dash white pepper

2 teaspoons salt (for cabbage)

1 package of Potsticker wrappers (in the fresh veggie section of most grocery stores by the Tofu "stuff").

Dipping sauce:

1/4 cup light sodium soy sauce

1 teaspoon sesame oil

Minced ginger and finely chopped chives to taste

Cabbage garnish:

Remainder of celery cabbage cut into bit size pieces mixed with your favorite Chinese Chicken Salad dressing (I used Girard's). Assembly of potstickers:

Cut the cabbage across into thin strips, Mix with 2 teaspoons of salt and set aside for 5 minutes. Squeeze out the excess moisture.

In a large bowl, mix together the cabbage, abalone, chives, minced ginger, wine, soy sauce, cornstarch, mashed cube of chicken stock, 5 spice powder, sesame oil, and white pepper.

Put small amounts of abalone mixture onto potsticker wrappers – follow directions on package on how to fill and seal wrappers. Frying up the potstickers:

In a large frying pan on hot, heat up 1 table-spoon vegetable oil. Place 8 to 10 potstickers with bottom (flat) side down in pan. Fry for about 2 minutes. Add ¼ cup of water to pan, cover pan and steam the potstickers for 5 to 7 minutes... serve on top of cabbage with dipping sauce.

1 lb of abalone yields approx. 50 to 60 potstickers. Enjoy!
