This camping trip has historically included a theme for campsite decoration, cooking and baking contests, raffles and the best part—ABALONEI























Announce your plans to the other members. You can speak up at a meeting (don't be shy, we're all interested in what you have to say) and either

Getting to Know DAN

Well, the short answer is its a non-profit group devoted to assisting divers in need, it is an evacuation and medical emergency resource.

It was founded in 1980 at Duke University with a hotline for diving accidents, and has expanded all over the world as a diver resource.

DAN is a wealth of information on all kinds of medical topics related to diving. Through collaborative research, DAN brings pertinent information to the concerned diver regarding all kinds of situations.

They provide a 24/7 hotline for calls regarding emergencies, and can act as a coordinator for medi-vac situations, even and ESPECIALLY in remote places.

This article cannot do justice to all the services DAN provides. Services to the general public include diving medical advise and training in first aid for dive-related accidents.

DAN offers travel and equipment insurance services as well.

Check em out! You don't even have to be a diver to have DAN coverage! It is really nice to have medical resources, especially when you're away from home.

I wouldn't dive without DAN in my set of resources. This would be echoed among the dive community if you asked.

Most divers have DAN. Do you and yours?
